

Chapter 10.16

PARKING

10.16.010 General requirements. All motor vehicles or other vehicles parked in the city shall comply with the requirements of this chapter. (Ord. 394 S1 (part), 1981.)

10.16.020 Angle parking. Parking at an angle of forty-five degrees from the curb and not more than eighteen inches therefrom on the following streets:

Ninth Street, both sides from its intersection with Union Pacific Railroad tracks on the South to its intersection with Ellen Street on the North; the South side of Della Street, West 102 feet from its intersection with Ninth. Vehicles with obstructed rear vision or vehicles which are obstructing the vision of those parking next to them, including but not limited to, vans, trucks with canopies, campers, side racks, or visual obstructing loads, shall not park in the angle parking space. (Ord. 518, September 1988.)

10.16.030 Parallel parking. On all of the streets and ways where permitted by law, all vehicles shall park on the right-hand side next to the curb or right boundary of the roadway and not more than eighteen inches therefrom. (Ord. 394 S1 (part), 1981.)

10.16.050 Limited term parking. No motor vehicle shall be or remain parked for a period in excess of ten (10) minutes at any parking stall on location designated by sign for the periods posted thereon. Any person violating this section shall be guilty of an infraction. Such location shall include:

- A. One parking stall immediately in front of city Hall from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. each office day. (Ord. 538, February, 1990.)

10.16.060 Parking Prohibited in Specific Places and for Specific Purposes.

- A. Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic, or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic control device, no person shall:
 - 1. Stop, stand, or park a vehicle:
 - a. On the roadway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a street;
 - b. On a sidewalk or street planting strip;
 - c. Within an intersection;
 - d. On a crosswalk;

- e. Between a safety zone and the adjacent curb or within thirty feet of points on the curb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone, unless official signs or markings indicate a different no-parking area opposite the ends of a safety zone;
 - f. Along side or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when stopping, standing, or parking would obstruct traffic;
 - g. At any place where official signs prohibit stopping;
 - h. At any place in an angled parking zone that restricts visibility for an entrance or exit, to or from, a public roadway or private lot; or
 - i. Upon a roadway in such a manner or under such conditions as to leave available less than ten feet of width of roadway for free movement of vehicular traffic or within an alley in such a position as to block the driveway entrance to any abutting property.
2. Stand or park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except momentarily to pick up or discharge a passenger or passengers:
- a. In front of a public or private driveway or within five feet of the end of the curb radius leading thereto;
 - b. Within fifteen feet of a fire hydrant;
 - c. Within fifteen feet of a crosswalk;
 - d. Within thirty feet upon the approach to any flashing signal, stop sign, yield sign, or traffic control signal located at the side of a roadway;
 - e. Within twenty feet of the driveway entrance to any fire station and on the side of a street opposite the entrance to any fire station within fifty feet of said entrance when properly sign- posted; or
 - f. At any place where official signs prohibit standing.
3. Park a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading property or passengers:
- a. At any place where official signs prohibit parking.
- B. It shall be unlawful for any person to reserve or attempt to reserve any portion of a highway for the purpose of stopping, standing, or parking to the exclusion of any other like person, nor shall any person be granted such right.
- C. No person shall park any vehicle upon any street for the principle purpose of:
- 1. Displaying advertising;
 - 2. Displaying such vehicle for sale;
 - 3. Selling merchandise from such vehicle, except when authorized; or
 - 4. For the principle purpose of washing or repairing such vehicle except repairs necessitated by an emergency. (Ord. 672, June 1998.)
